## ABOUT THIS GUIDE

On April 22, 1970, approximately 20 million people in different cities across the United States engaged in the first "Earth Day." By the end of that year, the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) was created, and the Clean Air, Clean Water, and Endangered Species Acts were passed. Fifty years later, environmental protections have improved, but there is still much work to be done to bring the planet back into balance. People are battling to decrease greenhouse gas emissions and mitigate the impacts of climate change; they are still pushing for cleaner air and water; they are striving to eliminate pervasive environmental toxins; and they are working to create a healthy, equitable, and sustainable food system.

In celebration of the 50th Anniversary of Earth Day this year, the City of Mountain View's Sustainability team had planned a big, in-person festival. However, the reality of COVID-19 became apparent, which forced us to cancel the event. Instead, we are bringing you this curated Resource Guide, which is a compilation of resources from 29 other Bay Area organizations and four City of Mountain View divisions that are working hard to address a variety of social and environmental issues. 



# Bay Area Water Supply & Conservation Agency (BAWSCA)

The Bay Area Water Supply and Conservation Agency (BAWSCA) was created on May 27, 2003 to represent the interests of 24 cities and water districts, and two private utilities, in Alameda, Santa Clara and San Mateo counties that purchase water on a wholesale basis from the San Francisco Regional Water system.

<u>Their website</u> includes resources for water conservation rebates, landscape classes, water saving tips, drought information, and more!



<u>Water Wise Gardening in the Bay Area</u> is full of information on how to garden beautifully while saving water. The website was produced specifically for BAWSCA member agencies in San Mateo, Santa Clara and Alameda Counties. The site includes garden tours and galleries of water efficient gardens, resources for planning your own landscape projects including plant selection tools, and a watering calculator to help you determine your yard's water needs and program your irrigation controller.



## BayREN

The Bay Area Regional Energy Network (BayREN) is a collaboration of the nine counties that make up the San Francisco Bay Area. Led by the Association of Bay Area Governments (ABAG), BayREN provides regional-scale energy efficiency programs, services, and resources.



Are you concerned about a possible water leak at home? <u>Learn how to read</u> <u>your water meter and check for leaks here</u>.

Valley Water also has a two-part <u>Water Wise Survey Program</u>. Part One is a Water Wise Outdoor Survey where customers can call and schedule a free irrigation inspection from a Valley Water irrigation professional. Part Two is a Do-it-Yourself Water Wise Indoor Survey Kit that addresses the steps for identifying leaks at home. These kits can be mailed and used during the Shelter-in-Place!


### Clorofil

### FabMo






Every year <u>FabMo</u> rescues approximately 70 tons of discontinued designer samples such as fabric, wallpaper, tile, and carpet, then makes them available to the creative community for reuse.

Goods are available at monthly Selection Events and Sales at our facility in Sunnyvale, and periodically at satellite events in Santa Cruz and elsewhere. In addition, we host meet-ups and workshops where people can learn new skills and meet like-minded creators.





## Rising Sun Center for Opportunity

Rising Sun Center for Opportunity is a local nonprofit that helps Bay Area residents conserve resources, address economic inequality, and foster a sustainable world by working to address the triple bottom line: **people, planet, and pathways.** Rising Sun does this by providing earn-and-learn opportunities for local youth (15–22 y/o) who in turn provide no-cost Green House Calls to homes throughout the community. During one <u>Green House Call appointment</u>, a resident may receive, at no cost:



- A home energy and water efficiency assessment.
- Installation of efficient LED light bulbs, shower heads, and faucet aerators.
- Installation of an Advanced Power Strip (approx. \$50 value).
- A toilet leak detection test.
- Information about BayREN's (Bay Area Regional Energy Network)
   Home+ program that offers up to \$5,000 in financial assistance and cash rebates for home energy improvements.



The younger generation has a key role to play in addressing the climate crisis. Young people across the country and the world are taking action to tackle climate change, often when their leaders have failed them.

Silicon Valley Youth Climate Action is organizing workshops, summits, strikes and mentoring Youth Climate Action Teams to combat climate change in their local jurisdiction through aggressive public policy initiatives. We bring together high school students, college students, and young adults to be inspired to make a difference in averting the climate crisis. Participants learn about and develop pathways to meaningful action in their local community.




