The City of Mountain View has declared a Stage 1 water shortage emergency. Please note the following water use restrictions are currently in effect:

Stage 1 Water Use Restrictions

Do Not:

- Allow water to run off into paved areas (gutters, sidewalks, streets).
- ★ Allow broken equipment to waste water.
- Wash paved surfaces and vehicles with a hose that does not have an automatic shutoff nozzle.

Do:

- Fix leaks within 10 days of noticing them.
- Install an automatic shutoff nozzle on your hose when washing paved surfaces and vehicles.
- Restaurants: Ask before serving water.
