Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) Instructions *for* Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program & City of Mountain View General Funds

Fiscal Year 2023-2024

Introduction

The City of Mountain View's Fiscal Year 2020-25 Consolidated Plan outlines six priority goals and how federal grants such as the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program will be used to achieve these goals. Annual Action plans are developed each year to implement the Five-Year Consolidated Plan and include a summary of the activities and projects that will be funded to further the priority goals. These goals are:

- Increase affordable housing for lower-income and special-needs households;
- Establish and support programs to prevent and end homelessness;
- Support activities that promote safety, security, wellness, and well-being for lower-income households and special-needs populations, such as seniors, abused and neglected youth, and the disabled;
- Support programs and activities that strengthen and enhance neighborhoods;
- Promote fair housing opportunities; and
- Promote economic resiliency and improve workforce development and skills training

Additionally, an annual allocation from the City's General Fund is used to supplement CDBG funds for public services (see table below for eligible activities). Public services are funded on a two-year cycle.

Notice of Funding Availability

The City is pleased currently to release its Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) for Fiscal Year 2023-24 (July 1, 2023 - June 30, 2024) for the following:

- CDBG (\$130,500) & City's General Fund (\$171,000) for public services that serve lower income households (first year of two-year funding cycle)
- CDBG (\$746,100) for Capital Projects for eligible projects and (\$30,000) to implement a minor home repair program

The NOFA application period begins December 5, 2022 and closes January 17, 2023 at 5:00 pm Pacific Standard Time. Complete applications must be submitted by the close of the application period and only through the City's Zoomgrants portal. Applications submitted to the City by any other means or format will not be accepted and will be disqualified. In case of questions, please see below for contact details:

The City reserves the right to request additional information from applicants at any time.

Applicants must attend the mandatory NOFA application pre-submittal webinar to be held at 9:00 am on December 16, 2022 or watch the webinar recording (which will be posted on the City website) prior to submitting the NOFA application.

Funding will be awarded subject to recommendations from the Human Relations Commission and approval by

the City Council in late April 2023. The Program year starts on July 1, 2023.

CDBG Eligible Public Service Activities include but are not limited to: health, recreational and employment services (e.g., job training); services for senior citizens and persons experiencing homelessness; fair housing counseling; education, child care and energy conservation programs; crime prevention and public safety activities and substance abuse services (e.g., counseling and treatment).

The City General Fund allocation supplements the CDBG funding for public services activities and is allocated to human service, educational, cultural, arts, and other programs not eligible for Federal funds.

In addition, CDBG funding is available for a Minor Home Repairs program. Examples of activities for capital projects include:

- Rehabilitation of residential and non-residential structures
- Relocation and demolition
- Acquisition of real property

The same evaluation criteria will be used to evaluate all public service and capital project applications.

Requirements

- Eligible applicants are limited to 501(c) 3 non-profit organizations, community-/faith-based organizations, government agencies, and school districts.
- Applicants who are awarded funding ("Subrecipients") must submit the following for City review and

approval:

- Affirmative Marketing Plan and (not required for General Fund public service subrecipients)
- A Reasonable Accommodation Policy
- Samples of translated program documents (including but not limited to marketing material, application, interest list registration, etc.) to a language other than English, such as Spanish, Mandarin, and Russian
- Language Access Plan (LAP) for Limited English Proficient (LEP) individuals

If you do not have one or more of the above items at the time of application submittal, you may still apply for funding. However, the applicant must include in the application a timeline of drafting the above list of documents and submittal to the City for review and approval by September 30, 2023. The City can offer technical assistance if your grant is approved. All documents will need to be submitted online through Zoom Grants via the 'Required Documents' tab of the application.

To affirmatively encourage meaningful outreach and participation of people who would benefit from the CDBG and City General fund programs, Subrecipients must:

- Uniformly collect demographic data using the <u>U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development</u>, <u>Office of Management and Budget (OMB) methods</u> of collecting data
- Analyze demographic data collected to ensure meaningful outreach of protected class.

The instructions provide an overview of the City's application process and general requirements. These instructions are not intended to be a full disclosure of all applicable federal, state, and/or local rules, regulations, procedures and/or reporting requirements.

Apply via Zoom Grants

The application period will open at 8:00 am on Monday, December 5, 2022 and will end at 5:00 pm on January 17, 2023. Applications that do not meet the 5:00 pm, January 17, 2023 deadline WILL NOT be accepted.
