

the city of mountain view is updating its *historic preservation ordinance and register*

The City of Mountain View's Historic Preservation Ordinance includes procedures for designating properties as historic resources on the local Register of Historic Resources, procedures for approval of modifications to historic resources, and incentives to encourage the preservation of historic resources. These provisions were adopted in 2004 along with a Register of Historic Resources.

why is an ordinance and register update necessary?

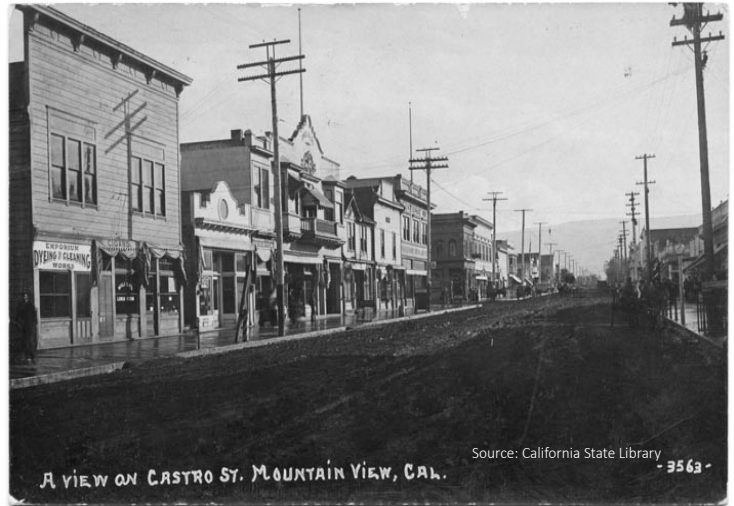
- Updates to the Ordinance and Register are occasionally necessary as periods of historic significance and community historic preservation goals change over time.
- Updating the Register will streamline development review by reducing the need for historic studies on many projects.
- Updating the Ordinance provides the opportunity to establish a process and criteria for the designation of local historic districts, which is not currently included in the Ordinance.
