



Trees are a valued community resource in Mountain View. They are an important component of civic infrastructure and part of the City's identity. The City of Mountain View has been committed to preserving its urban forest since 1960, when the City Council established tree care services. Trees provide our community with numerous benefits, including:

### **Energy Conservation**

Tree canopies offer shade, add moisture to the air, and limit wind forces.

# **Improved Air Quality**

Trees pull carbon dioxide from the air and reduce pollution.

#### **Preserve Natural Habitat**

Trees provide shelter and food for our wildlife.

## **Reduced Risks of Flooding**

Trees pull stormwater into the ground and prevent soil erosion.

### **Better Quality of Life**

Trees beautify neighborhoods and improve mental and physical health.

Mountain View values all trees, but we have special requirements for Heritage trees. A Heritage tree is defined as one of the following:

- Any tree with a trunk circumference of 48" or more, measured at 54" above the natural grade. Multi-trunk trees are measured just below the first major trunk fork.
- Any oak, redwood, or cedar tree with a circumference of 12" or more when measured 54" above natural grade.

The removal of a Heritage tree is only permitted when the tree meets the criteria outlined in the Heritage Tree Ordinance (<u>Chapter 32</u> of the Mountain View City Code (MVCC)), including the condition, location, necessity for construction, conforming use, and best practices. Chapter 32 can be referenced here: <u>MVCC Chapter 32</u>.

Replanting requirements are based on project type and space available, with the majority requiring a 15-gallon tree replanted on-site for every Heritage tree removed. If replacement cannot be carried out on-site, the City will require in-lieu fees.

In Mountain View, we are committed to the preservation and enhancement of our trees. Thank you for your stewardship and thoughtful consideration regarding decisions related to trees. The future of Mountain View's urban forest depends on it.
